
2025 Human Race 5K



The United Way Human Race 5K is a community fundraiser that allows participants to raise money for the nonprofit of their choice. Proceeds go directly to local nonprofits, making a direct impact on the services and programs that strengthen Randolph County. The race features a TAC-certified 5K Run and a walk that begins and finishes in Bicentennial Park.

Participating non-profit organizations receive 75-80% of the money collected, and The Volunteer Center receives the remaining percentage. This family-friendly event brings together people of all ages and abilities for a fun-filled day of exercise, entertainment, and giving back to the community.
