ALICE

What Is ALICE and Why Does It Matter in Randolph County?

ALICE stands for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed-households that earn above the Federal Poverty Level but still struggle to afford basic necessities like housing, food, transportation, and healthcare. In Randolph County, 49% of households are below the ALICE Threshold, highlighting a significant portion of our community facing financial hardship.
